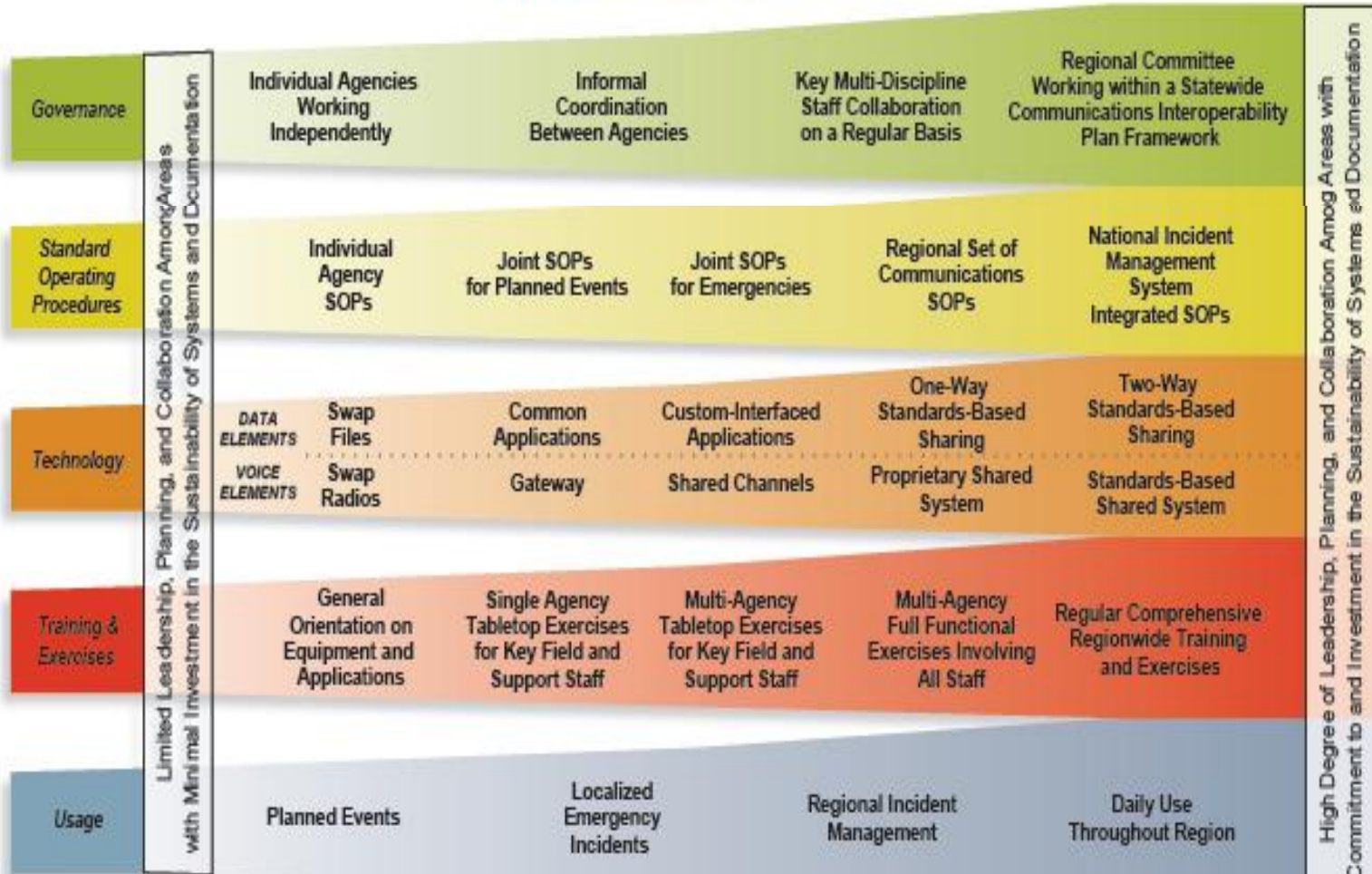

SAFECOM Guidance
on Emergency Communications Grants



- The purpose of the *FY 2011 SAFECOM Guidance* is to provide guidance to grantees on:
 - Emergency communications activities that can be funded through Federal grants
 - Technical standards that facilitate interoperability
 - Recommendations for planning, coordinating, and implementing emergency communications projects

Interoperability Continuum



- Narrowband Mandate
 - “In the *FY 2011 SAFECOM Guidance*, grantees are encouraged to *allocate grant funds* to plan and implement activities that will ensure compliance with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) *narrowband* mandate by the January 1, 2013, deadline.” (pg 4)

- Consider Regional, Multi-Jurisdictional, Multi-Disciplinary Projects
 - Improve emergency communications across jurisdictions (e.g., across States, counties)
 - Enables communication across jurisdictions, between disciplines, and among all levels of government
 - Expands coverage to unserved or underserved areas within or beyond a region
 - Links disparate systems
 - Connects local systems and responders to regional or statewide systems

“Regional projects (intra-State and/or inter-State projects that include more than one jurisdiction) should **promote wide area interoperability** and **not create new barriers** between responders inside and outside of the region. For example, grant funding should not advance a “proprietary-based project” when an equivalent “open standards” solution exists”

- **Consider Broadband and Emerging Technologies**
 - Grantees should consider investments in broadband planning and technologies* in order to continue to move their jurisdiction toward greater interoperability nationwide

*The FCC has advised grantees to ensure that investments in wireless broadband networks are compliant with 3 GPP-Release 8 of the **Long-Term Evolution (LTE) standard**, and have required grantees to provide information on how the investment will achieve interoperability with other public safety networks, including a statement on whether the interface is compliant with 3 GPP-Release 8 of the LTE standard.

FY 2011 Grants to Reduce Sexual Assault, Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking on Campus Program
Know as "The Campus Program"**

The Office on Violence Against Women (OVW), a component of the U.S. Department of Justice, provides national leadership in developing the nation's capacity to reduce violence against women through the implementation of the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) and subsequent legislation.

Created in 1995, OVW administers financial and technical assistance to communities across the country that are developing programs, policies, and practices aimed at ending domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. In addition to overseeing 12 federal grant programs, OVW often undertakes a number of special initiatives in response to areas of special need, dedicating resources to develop enhancements in areas requiring particular attention or in communities facing particularly acute challenges.

The Campus Program focuses on sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking that are serious problems on college and university campuses. Addressing these crimes on campuses raises unique issues and challenges that Congress sought to address by creating the Campus Program.

Common Problems Identified During Peer Review

- Uncertainty whether research will produce significant information.
- Scientific basis not fully developed.
- No apparent translatability of research into practice or policy.
- Lack of a theoretical framework.
- Overly ambitious research plan, volume of proposed work unrealistic.
- Lack of original ideas.
- Proposed methods not appropriate to answer research questions.
- Research issues are more general than investigator describes.
- Too little detail on methods (leads to reviewers questioning investigators' methods).
- Lack of focus on hypotheses, aims and/or research plan.
- Lack of expertise in methodology.
- Study design lacks experimental design areas.
- Proposed team and/or team members insufficient.
- Lack of studies on primary data.
- Inadequate attention to protection of human subjects and/or population representation.
- Lack of complete literature review.
